#### A letter to the Class of 2024

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Congratulations! Your graduation is a significant accomplishment, and the whole Church in the Diocese of Columbus rejoices with you. Your hard work has paid off. We are grateful for your parents, family members, teachers, administrators, coaches, and friends who have accompanied you on your journey and helped you to make the most of your God-given talents. As you go forth into the world, please know of our heartfelt congratulations and our continued support.

In the modern day, sometimes we reduce education to learning technical things; to getting good grades; to getting into a good college or university; and, ultimately, to getting a high paying job that we will find satisfying and for which others will respect us.

Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk, the late Archbishop of Cincinnati, once said to me: "Don't let your studies get in the way of your education." At the time, I was leaving for doctoral studies in Rome, but I think what he meant is that our education involves much more than what we read in books. The true education is the education of the heart. The primary concern of a true and sufficient education is that of educating the human heart as God made it.

Each one of us has been given a heart by God – a heart that longs for that which is true, good and beautiful. Each of us has a longing within us to belong, to love and to be loved. It is precisely this heart that must be educated. This means apprehending the reality that is before us. Authentic education trains the mind to think critically – not negatively – about reality. How does what we see and encounter in reality correspond to the desires of the heart?

Education assists us in seeking the truth – in authentic investigation – rather than simply accepting propaganda. It means being open to that which is before us and to exploring it more profoundly. Education certainly involves more than what one reads in books. It involves relationships. During my time in Rome, I learned a lot about art and architecture, about the history of Western civilization, about food and cultures simply from walking around the city, but I would say I learned even more from the people I met in Rome.

Time and again, over a meal or in the TV room, I would have a good conversation with a fellow priest. I would learn about what he was studying, but I would also learn from his experience. In the course of a human encounter – through a conversation – we would communicate something of our experience to each other. This is also part of the educative experience.

I would invite you – our graduates – to think about what has been communicat-



ed to you by your principals, teachers, coaches and friends through your educational journey. What are those lessons which you learned that aren't found in books?

Although I spent the majority of my life in the classroom as a student, teacher or professor, I would have to say that most of my education I received on my knees, conversing with the Teacher par excellence. Jesus invites us to come to Him: "Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you. Take my yoke open your shoulders and learn from me, for I am meek in humble of heart."

From Jesus, we learn how to develop not only a humble heart but a compassionate heart. In the story of the Good Samaritan, the priest and Levite are well-educated in the law, but they do not have the emotional intelligence to do the right thing; whereas, the Good Samaritan, a figure of Jesus Himself, sees where mercy and compassion are needed and acts.

Jesus, in dining with tax collectors and sinners, teaches us not to be judgmental but to offer others hope. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, lays down His life for His friends, demonstrating the value of sacrificial love. Jesus educates us to the value of service in washing His disciples' feet. It is He who challenges us to arise from mediocrity, functionalism and efficiency to the greatness to which the human person is called – to live, not as a slave to work or efficiency, but to live in the freedom of the sons and daughters of God. In the end, we hope that we have offered you an education that serves you now and into eternity.

#### St. Anthony students find home at OLP, graduate from eighth grade

When Columbus St. Anthony School closed in 2023, most of its students transferred to Columbus Our Lady of Peace (OLP) and many of them are now graduating from eighth grade at the school this year.

Despite the unexpected transition into a new student body for their last year before high school, the students found a welcoming home among the OLP community.

"When I heard that St. Anthony was closing ... my heart immediately went out to the students, the staff, the teachers and the community," OLP principal Jim Silcott said. "I knew that many of (them) had been there for many years.

"Father Dooley, our pastor, and I knew ... that if we could offer assistance in relocating the students or assisting staff in finding new employment, we were going to find a way to do it. The distance between our schools is only three miles".

At an event organized by the diocese to connect St. Anthony parents with other schools, Silcott said he was impressed by the parents' determination to find a new school with a welcoming community for their children.

"Additionally," he said, "their passionate desire to keep their children in a Catholic school was a powerful testimony to the Catholic values they had learned at St. Anthony."

When Silcott found out the St. Anthony seventh graders were open to moving to OLP for their eighth-grade year, he went to the seventh-grade class at OLP to gauge their openness to the St. Anthony students joining them.

"I was overjoyed at their support in making (it) happen," he said. Of the 17 seventh graders from St. Anthony, 13 transferred to OLP for eighth grade. Additionally, Silcott said, "We took in another 30 students in the lower grades." In order to get the rising eighth-graders from both schools acquainted with one another, The Catholic Foundation provided a grant for them to attend a field trip in May 2023 to ZipZone, a zipline adventure park in Columbus.

Fourteen-year-old Julien McElroy, who had attended St. Anthony since kindergarten, said he appreciated the opportunity to connect with the OLP students before starting the school year. "I felt like that really helped us build bonds with each other," he said.

The following day, the students gathered again, this time at OLP, for what was dubbed a Constitutional Convention.

"We elected student council leadership and representatives for the new school year," Silcott said. They also discussed hopes and plans for the annual eighth-grade trip they would take and gave the St. Anthony students an opportunity to share any traditions they'd like to bring over from their former school.

"On both days, the students got along well and I knew that they would all be good classmates together," Silcott said.

Over the course of their eighth-grade year, many friendships developed among the students that would influence their plans for high school.

Chloe McNally, who started at OLP in the fourth grade, said her St. Anthony friends helped her make the decision to attend Columbus St. Francis DeSales High School.

"I was going to go to (Columbus) Watterson (High School)," she said, "but I thought, 'I think I'll have it better (if I stay) with these friends." Among other things, McNally noted the good moral influence of the former St. Anthony students who are now her closest friends.

Despite the difficulty in saying goodbye to St. Anthony, the eighth graders have found contentment among their new community.

Orianna Strickland, who attended St.

Anthony from kindergarten through seventh grade, said that one of the things that made leaving so hard was saying goodbye to the principal, Christina Iaconis. But Strickland said she truly enjoys her new principal as well. "(We) love Mr. Silcott," she said. "(and) the OLP community."

Silcott said the highlight of the 2023-24 school year was the preparation and production of OLP's spring musical, "Crooked Tree," which the seventh and eighth graders performed May 22 at the Bishop Watterson High School theater. "Here is where I have seen true teamwork in action," Silcott said.

OLP's graduating eighth-grade class includes 43 students, and 42 of them will attend Bishop Watterson, St. Francis DeSales or St. Charles Preparatory School in the fall.

"Thirty percent of our graduates have received some sort of merit scholarship to high school," Silcott said. The scholarships are from OLP, the high schools and organizations such as the Serra Club, which supports vocations, and the Christ Child Society, which serves children in need.

The eighth graders said they look forward to carrying on the friendships they've established into high school and beyond.

"This class will truly be remembered as a remarkable class," Silcott said. "I pray for their success and fulfillment in advancing the Kingdom of God in the years ahead."

#### 215 graduate from Bishop Watterson

Columbus Bishop Watterson High School awarded diplomas to 215 graduating seniors on Saturday, May 25 in the school gymnasium. A baccalaureate Mass was celebrated there on Thursday, May 23.

Ninety-seven percent of the class members were accepted by a total of 160 institutions of higher education and received more than \$29 million in college merit scholarship offers. They will be attending 56 different colleges and universities. Two percent will be attending a trade school or public safety academy and one percent are undecided or taking a gap or service year.

The school awarded 86 state honors diplomas, with 93 students receiving the Presidential Award for Excellence. Seven class members had perfect scores in individual subjects on the American College Test. Class members totaled 7,165 service hours.

There were 162 academic medals, presented for an "A" average all four years, awarded in individual subjects. Eleven students received service charity cords for at least 250 hours of community ser-

#### St. Charles graduates 119 seniors

Columbus St. Charles Preparatory School presented diplomas to 119 members of the Class of 2024 during its commencement ceremony, preceded by a baccalaureate Mass, on Friday, May 24 in the Robert C. Walter Student Commons.

#### Teacher finishes 50th year at Ready, 51st in diocese

As the school year came to a close, Air Force veteran, Spanish teacher and former coach Dean Tower completed his 50th year at Columbus Bishop Ready High School and his 51st year teaching in the Diocese of Columbus.

The 81-year-old began his teaching career in 1972 at Columbus Father Wehrle High School on the south side. The school closed in 1991.

After one year at Wehrle, Tower moved over to Bishop Ready, where he has remained for the past five decades.

"When I signed my first contract to teach at Ready, I thought that I was just committing to a job," Tower said. "Lit-tle did I know that I was committing to something more.

'The Ready community is a tightly knit family. The students, parents, staff and faculty are all members of (that) family. Whenever I had any personal difficulties in my life, it was my Ready family that I could turn to for empathy and support."

When Tower's wife of 30 years, Maria, passed away in 1996, he said he found much consolation in the Ready commu-

"The Ready family was there for me and my family with an outpouring of love and support in so many ways," he said. "For me, Ready is more than a place to work. It has become a home away from home for more than half of my

third year as Ready's principal and 22nd year at the school, spoke highly of Tower and his ability to connect with the students.

"(He) ... has a blend of knowledge, passion and dedication to teaching," Brickner said. "He (has created) a learning environment that students continue to find success in. Being in the classroom over 50 years, seeing the changes in the world and in our society, and being able to adjust and adapt to new ideas, technology, and changing curriculum (all) demonstrate why he is a great teacher."

Tower, a Massachusetts native, enlisted in the Air Force immediately after his 1960 high school graduation.

"My first posting was in Columbus, where I met Maria. We were married in 1966," he said. The couple settled in Columbus and were blessed with three children and four grandchildren.

After serving two tours of duty, Tower was honorably discharged from the Air Force in 1968 and then enrolled at Ohio State University. He graduated with a degree in education, specializing in Spanish and English, and was soon hired at Wehrle to teach English and coach wrestling and football.

After a year at Wehrle, he returned to Ohio State to pursue a graduate degree.

Currently, he teaches Spanish classes at Ready as well as Spanish I online to students at Columbus St. Cecilia School, Columbus Trinity Catholic School and ,Chillicothe Bishop Flaget School.

In addition to wrestling and football, Tower has coached both track and cross country over the years.

"Students that he taught and ... coached ... recognize his love for them," Bricker said. "This past spring, two of his former cross-country runners called him from Boston the day before they ran in the Boston Marathon."

The runners, who had been coached by Tower more than a decade earlier, wanted to tell him they were doing the marathon in his hometown.

Growing up in Massachusetts, Tower was raised Catholic and said the values of the faith are part of his core beliefs to this day.

"Teaching in a Catholic school has given me the opportunity to infuse these values into my classroom and teaching," [che said. "Hopefully, I have served as a positive role model for my students and they will not only learn the Spanish language and culture, but will also leave my class as better people, equipped with the values needed to be productive citizens."

Tower said that throughout his decades of teaching the biggest change he has noticed is the use of technology in the classroom.

"Being from the chalk-and-talk generation, it was a challenge for me to make the change to the technology era," he said. "But I have ... embraced it wholeheartedly."

Reflecting on his years in the diocese, Tower said he recalls the names and faces of the many students he has taught and coached.

"They represent the fondest and warmest memories," he said. "They were the reason that I walked into the building each and every day. It's amazing that I am teaching the grandchildren of many of the students that I taught during the early years."

Tower plans to continue teaching in the fall.

"I still enjoy the kids and teaching gives me purpose and a reason to get out of bed every morning," he said. "I have reduced my class load, but I still have the same enthusiasm I had back in 1974."


